

Three Individuals Lodge Police Reports Over Indelible Ink

KOTA KINABALU, May 7 (Bernama) -- Three individuals lodged separate reports claiming that the indelible ink used in last Sunday's polls could be washed off with water.

Bobby Andy E Majimbun, 35, who voted at Sekolah Rendah Tick Nam, Inanam; Wong Sin Yee, 36 at Foh Sang Community Hall, Luyang; and Pan Yin Hsia, 33 at Sekolah Menengah Kebangsaan Bahang, Penampang made the reports at the Kota Kinabalu police head quarters today afternoon.

The complainants claimed that the ink came off less than 24 hours after they cast their votes and said this should not be the case as the Election Commission had stated it would last for three to four days.

Wong told reporters that she realised the ink had completely washed off after having a shower on Sunday night, without any scrubbing or use of bleach. Meanwhile, Kota Kinabalu police chief ACP Jauteh Dikun said he had not been informed of the reports so far.
