

Johor Exco Member Tee's Status Among Focus At MCA CC Meeting

KUALA LUMPUR, May 20 (Bernama) -- Deciding on the date for the upcoming MCA party election and its national organising secretary Datuk Tee Siew Kiong's status will be among the main focus of the party's Central Committee (CC) meeting tomorrow, the first to be held since the 13th general election (GE13) on May 5.

Party secretary-general Datuk Seri Kong Cho Ha said hopefully, the meeting could agree on a date to convene the party's polls.

MCA had announced that its party election would be expedited, and to be held earliest in June. The election for the top party posts is expected to be in October.

On the issue related to Tee's decision to accept a Johor state executive council (exco) post, Kong said he did not receive any complaint from anyone with regard to the matter.

"The disciplinary board can only act if there is an official complaint. But so far, I have not received any complaint," he said in a telephone interview with Bernama, on Monday.

MCA had maintained its stand to adhere to the party's 2011 resolution of not accepting any government post if it performed badly in the GE13.

However, for the Johor state exco line-up, the Johor Sultan, Sultan Ibrahim had decreed that MCA be allocated a seat in the exco.

Kong said the central committee would deliberate on the party's dismal general election outing.

The party only secured seven parliamentary and 11 state seats in the GE13, compared to 15 parliamentary and 32 state seats it won in 2008.
