

**PAS veep called up by police for rally probe**

KUALA LUMPUR, June 7 — PAS vice-president Salahuddin Ayub has been called up by the police for investigations today into his role in an illegal gathering, Harakah Daily reported today.

"I am required to appear at the Kepong police station tomorrow (Friday) under section 143 of the Penal Code," Salahuddin was quoted as saying yesterday by Harakah.

Section 143 of the Penal Code is used against those who have allegedly participated in unlawful assemblies, with the penalty being a jail term that can extend to six months or a fine or both.

But Salahuddin did not know which rally the police were referring to, the PAS mouthpiece reported.

Harakah reported that Salahuddin viewed this as an act of revenge and claimed that Prime Minister Datuk Seri Najib Razak had gone back on his promise to respect fundamental rights.

Salahuddin said these moves would not deter further efforts to tell the public that Najib's administration was allegedly formed through electoral fraud.

"This kind of tactics to threaten will not work and the people cannot be intimidated," Salahuddin said.

Pakatan Rakyat (PR) has been holding a series of rallies termed "Black 505" following the May 5 general election, claiming that its victory was stolen by political rival Barisan Nasional (BN).

Despite BN retaining its hold on power by winning 133 federal seats against PR's 89 seats, PR has repeatedly pointed out that it had won the popular vote.
