

**Malaysia Continues Task In SDG For Member States**

KUALA LUMPUR, Sept 27 (Bernama) -- Malaysia will continue its task in the form of sustainable development goals (SDGs) and will ensure the outcome benefits the United Nations General Assembly's (UNGA) member states for the future generation.

Foreign Minister Datuk Seri Anifah Aman said in formulating the SDGs, member states should keep the interest of developing countries in mind, in particular, the least developed countries.

"In this regard, it should ensure the SDG process is coherent with the post-2015 UN development agenda process in that the design, structure and choice of SDGs are in line with what developing countries want to achieve in the development agenda," he said.

Anifah said this in his speech at the special event to follow-up efforts made towards achieving the Millenium Development Goals (MDGs) at the United Nations, New York on Wednesday (Sept 25).

His speech text was faxed to Bernama today.

Anifah also emphasised that the SDGs should not be a set of goals for only developing countries to undertake as a kind of conditionality or new obligations applying only to them at national level.

He said the SDGs would continue and accelerate the work begun under the banner of the MDGs, achieve greater economic and social inclusion and also create integration and balance among economic, social and environmental aspirations.
