

RM10 Million Suit Over "Donation" To MCA Settled

KUALA LUMPUR, Oct 7 (Bernama) -- The RM10 million suit over a "donation" to MCA filed by Bintulu MP Datuk Seri Tiong King Sing against former MCA president Datuk Seri Ong Tee Keat was settled Monday.

High Court Judicial Commissioner S. M. Komathy Suppiah recorded the settlement after both parties had reached an agreement over the suit.

"By consent the claim (suit) is dismissed with costs," said Komathy.

Earlier, Tiong's counsel Datuk K.Kumaraendran informed the court that the parties had come to a settlement and wished the terms be recorded.

Outside the court, Ong told reporters that he was vindicated that after four years the suit finally had been resolved.

When asked on the terms of the settlement, Ong's counsel Chan Tse Yuen said: "The parties are not allowed to disclose the terms of settlement".

The parties reached settlement after the court had heard evidence from six plaintiff's witnesses while Ong, who was the defendant in the suit, also testified.

In his statement of claim, Tiong alleged that he had given RM10 million to the MCA through Ong when the latter was the party vice-president.

Tiong was seeking a refund of the money which he claimed to have handed over to Ong as a "donation" to MCA.
