

**MAS Plane: Incident Gets Global Attention Via Social Website**

KUALA LUMPUR, March 9 (Bernama) -- The incident of the missing Malaysia Airlines (MAS) plane that disappeared from the radar after it departed from the Kuala Lumpur International Airport (KLIA) on Saturday has shocked the whole world.

Since it occurred, members of the global community have expressed their sympathy, concern and hope through the social website, blog, short message service(SMS), whatsapp and others.

Through the Facebook social site, an account 'Missing Malaysia Airlines MAS Flight MH370' has received the attention of many people with 265,401 'likes' recorded.

One of those, who has expressed her sympathy was Fiona Bisionia, who said : "My heart dropped when I think about the passengers and crew members. Even though none of my family members are involved, we, as concerned people will definitely feel sad. Hope that flight MH730 passengers and crew are safe wherever they are. God bless MH370."

Meanwhile Nicole Ganes said "Lord, we lift up flight MH370 to You. We pray that You will shield them from every harm and danger. As there are passengers that consists of children, adults or even the elderly and it doesn't matter what race, religion or denomination they hail from."

Apart from that account, another one that attracted the people's attention is 'Pray For MH370,' which received 167,514 'likes'.

The Twitter social media site has also become the trend, which attracted many people, who expressed their concern about the incident via 'hashtags' #PrayForMH370 dan #MH370.

Users of the two social websites did not only expressed their deep concern and prayers but many of them also shared photographs relating to the incident.

There are also others, who tried to make their own evaluation, speculation and theories without considering its sensitivity to the passengers' families and MAS crew involved.

Besides that, local radio and television stations also gave full attention by providing full coverages on the incident.

Flight MH370, with 227 passengers, including two infants, and 12 crew members, went missing during its flight from Kuala Lumpur to Beijing about two hours after its departure from KLIA at 12.41 am on Saturday.

It was to land in Beijing at 6.30 am.
