

**News Of Missing MAS Plane Makes Newspaper Front-page Headlines Around The World**

KUALA LUMPUR, March 9 (Bernama) -- News of the missing Malaysia Airlines (MAS) flight was the headline story today of many newspapers around the world.

'The Australian' newspaper carried the headline "Flight families pray for miracle" while the 'Sydney Morning Herald' had "Oil slicks found at sea in search for Malaysia jet" on the front page.

'USA Today' had "Stolen passports add to flight mystery" on its front page.

The Sunday edition of 'The Observer' of Britain reported the news with the front-page headline: "Oil slicks spotted in sea as plane disappears with 239 feared dead".

'The New York Times' said "Passport Theft Adds to Mystery of Missing Jet Carrying 239" on its front page.

'The Washington Post' carried the news with the headline "Passport mystery adds to concern over missing jet".

'Beijing Bulletin' had the headline "Passengers with stolen passport on board Malaysia Airlines Flight" on its front page.

The 'Chicago Tribune', on its front page, carried the story "Malaysian Airlines says 'Fearing the Worst' for Missing Jet".

MAS Flight MH370, carrying 227 passengers, including two infants, and 12 crew, went missing en route from Kuala Lumpur to Beijing about an hour after taking off from KLIA at 12.41 am Saturday. It should have landed in Beijing at 6.30 am.
