

Rosmah Expresses Sympathy To Families Of MH370 Passengers, Crew

KUALA LUMPUR, March 26 (Bernama) -- Datin Seri Rosmah Mansor has expressed profound sympathy and conveyed her condolences to family members, friends and acquaintances of the passengers and crew of Malaysia Airlines (MAS) MH370 whose flight path ended in the southern Indian Ocean after the aircraft went missing on March 8.

In a statement here Wednesday, the prime minister's wife called on all family members of the passengers and crew to be strong in accepting the will of God.

Rosmah said her feelings of sympathy for Flight MH370 was also shared by people worldwide.

"I have received telephone calls from several wives of world leaders to express sympathy over the tragedy.

"I thanked them for their concerns and it shows Malaysia has many friends in such times of need," she said.

Flight MH370 from Kuala Lumpur to Beijing went missing from the radar screen about an hour after taking off at 12.41am from the KL International Airport on March 8.

The aircraft was carrying 227 passengers and 12 crew members in which 38 passengers and all 12 crew members were Malaysians.

After 17 days of search and rescue operation, Prime Minister Datuk Seri Najib Tun Razak on Monday, announced that based on satellite data analyses by Inmarsat and Air Accident Investigation Branch of Britain, "Flight MH370 had ended in the southern Indian Ocean".

"I understand the 17 days were a trying time for family members of the victims.

"I prayed for Allah's grace to give strength to all family members to go through this crisis," said Rosmah.
