

MH370: Purported Meeting By A U.S. Firm Cancelled

KUALA LUMPUR, April 12 (Bernama) -- A meeting purportedly organised by a firm said to be from the United States scheduled for today with families of those on board the ill-fated Malaysia Airlines jetliner was cancelled due to poor response.

The meeting, advertised in a local newspaper by a company claiming to have experience in assisting families of air crash victims, was scheduled to take place at a hotel in the capital at 3.30pm.

The media was also invited to attend the meeting.

The advertisement expresses the wish to contribute its expertise in assisting families of the passengers and crew of the Beijing-bound MH370 flight which went missing on March 8.

It also claims that the company will provide information, legal assistance and evidence from relevant parties to the families for free.

Bernama tried in vain to seek further clarification on the event by calling the telephone number advertised.

A man who answered the call said: "I don't know anything. I don't have the information. I don't know anything about it (the meeting)."

A multinational effort to locate MH370 in the Indian Ocean, where it was believed to have ended its flight path, has entered 36th day today.
