

Malaysians Advised To Postpone Non-essential Travel To Thailand

KUALA LUMPUR, May 20 (Bernama) -- Malaysians have been advised to consider postponing non-essential visits to Thailand following the imposition of martial law by the Royal Thai Army.

The Foreign Ministry said Malaysians presently in Thailand should remain vigilant and monitor developments via local and international media.

It said there were 596 Malaysians residing in Thailand who had registered with the Malaysian embassy in Bangkok.

"There have been no reports of Malaysians who have been adversely affected by the latest development in Thailand," the ministry said.

It said Malaysia hoped that all parties in Thailand continue to work towards finding a peaceful solution to issues facing that country.

Malaysia would continue to monitor closely the political developments in Thailand, it said.
