

**DAP, PKR excos agree on voting before any Selangor decision**

In a sign of a growing split between embattled Selangor Menteri Besar Tan Sri Khalid Ibrahim and his government, six of his executive councilors (exco) said any decisions made at the state cabinet meetings will have to go through a voting process.

They said this was one of the three mandates set by both DAP and PKR for its excos.

DAP's excos are Teng Chang Kim, Ean Yong Hian Wah and V. Ganabatirau, while PKR's excos are Rodziah Ismail, Wong Keat Ping and Dr Daroyah Alwi.

In a statement signed by all six of them, the excos said Khalid and his state cabinet cannot make any decision without going through a vote.

"Any decision by the state exco have to be put to the vote so that Khalid's functions are limited towards the transition capacity," they said in a joint statement.

Other than the weekly exco meetings, they stressed they will not meet with the two-term MB to avoid any discussions on their respective parties stand.

While they respected the consent of the state Ruler that Khalid is still the MB, they said his position and functions is temporary in this transition period pending the appointment of PKR president Datuk Seri Dr Wan Azizah Wan Ismail as the new MB.

"As respect to the decision of the Sultan as well as the needs of the people, we will continue with our daily duties until a new MB from Pakatan Rakyat is appointed to replace Khalid," they said and pledged to work their best while expressing hopes

that this matter can be resolved soon.

Khalid was supposed to meet his 10 excos today to find out if they were still willing to work under him, but those from the DAP and PKR snubbed him.

However, PAS met with the under fire MB with the Islamist party's exco Dr Ahmad Yunus Hairi saying it was a short discussion on running the state.

Following a two-hour meeting by Selangor's Royal Advisory Council at the Istana Alam Shah yesterday, the sultan consented to Khalid to continue as MB.

The Port Klang assemblyman said he had informed the sultan that he still commanded the majority of the support of the assemblymen, despite his sacking from PKR on August 9.

PKR expelled Khalid for defying the party's orders to step down as MB and make way for Dr Wan Azizah to replace him.

His expulsion came weeks after the MB crisis threatened to split Pakatan between PAS, which supports Khalid, and PKR and DAP, which want him removed. – August 12, 2014.
