

**MH17: Malaysia Ready To Send Next-Of-Kins To Netherlands To View Wreckage**

KAMPAR, Feb 27 (Bernama) -- Transport Minister Datuk Seri Liow Tiong Lai said Malaysia was ready to send the next-of-kins of crash victims on board Malaysian Airlines (MAS) Flight MH17 to the Netherlands if invited to see the plane's wreckage.

"If they invite we welcome the move...It is good that the next-of-kins can participate," he told reporters after launching the 'Public Relations Campaign 2014/2015: Volunteerism IV at Universiti Tunku Abdul Rahman, here today.

An English newspaper had reported the Dutch Safety Board (DSB) would, from March 3, attend to families of victims invited to the Royal Netherlands Air Force base in Gilze-Rijen, about 45km from Eindhoven.

The DSB will allow them to look at the pieces of wreckage investigators had recovered from the crash site in Donetsk, Ukraine, where it was shot down.

He said Malaysia had sent officers from the Department of Civil Aviation (DCA) and MAS engineers to assist in the reconstruction of the aircraft for investigation purpose.

"Currently it is in the investigation stage ... they will have to submit the report before we can know what caused the crash once and for all determining whether the plane was shot by missiles from the ground or it was an air-to-air attack," he said.

Flight MH17 crashed in eastern Ukraine on July 17 as it was flying from Amsterdam to Kuala Lumpur with 283 passengers and 15 crew on board. The Boeing 777-200 aircraft is believed to have been shot down over the troubled country
