

Malaysian And Indonesian Youths Want To Unite Language

JAKARTA, March 15 (Bernama) -- The Selangor Youth Council (MBS) and the Indonesian National Youth Committee (KNPI) want the Malaysian and Indonesian languages to be merged into a single language used at the international level.

Selangor Youth Council (MBS) chairman Datuk Irmohizam Ibrahim today said the two youth organizations agreed that the languages of the two countries shared the same roots and should become the Asean language, in line with the concept of creating an Asean community raised this year.

He said a committee would be established between MBS and the KPNI to refine the words used in the Malaysian and Indonesian languages to create a better understanding in terms of their usage.

He said the matter would also be proposed at the Consultative Council of the Malaysian Youth Council (MBM) in order to plan an agenda.

"Malaysia is the host nation for Asean 2015 and language should be one of the agendas sought in conjunction with establishing an Asean community," he told reporters after a meeting with the leadership of KNPI here.

Irmohizam said he would bring the language motion to the parliament in an effort to further strengthen mutual understanding among the younger generation of both countries.
