

**Indonesia's Jupiter Aerobatic Team Withdraws From LIMA 2015 After Crash**

LANGKAWI, March 16 (Bernama) -- The Jupiter Aerobatic Team from the Indonesian Air Force (TNI-AU) has decided to withdraw from the Langkawi International Maritime and Aerospace 2015 exhibition (LIMA'15) after four of its pilots were involved in an aerial display rehearsal mishap yesterday.

Indonesian Air Force (TNI-AU) First Marshall Indra Yadi confirmed the decision and said the team would withdraw from the biannual event due to the mishap yesterday.

"Accidents can happen anywhere and anytime. This incident does not dampen our spirit to fly. The Indonesian Air Force will still be here (LIMA) for the event."

"Only the Jupiter Aerobatic Team will head back to Indonesia," he told reporters after visiting the four pilots at the Langkawi Hospital here Monday.

Indra was an observer from the Indonesian Air Force who flew with the pilots during the rehearsal.

He said TNI-AU felt sorry for the owner of the house whose premises was damaged when the plane crash landed on it.

Meanwhile, Langkawi Hospital director Dr Mansor Ismail said all four Indonesian pilots who suffered minor injuries in the mishap would be discharged today.

Yesterday, Indonesian Defence Minister Ryamizard Ryacudu and his Malaysian counterpart, Datuk Seri Hishammuddin Hussein also visited the injured pilots.

The two Jupiter aircrafts crashed at Permandangan Indah, Padang Mat Sirat and Kampung Gelam, Kedawang just outside the airport around 2pm yesterday.

Two pilots and their two passengers managed to eject before the aircraft crashed.
