

#KitaLawan Gathering Is Self-indulgent, Uncivilised And Meaningless - Twitter Users Bernama Mar 7, 2015

KUALA LUMPUR, March 7 (Bernama) -- The #KitaLawan gathering held in the city today has been described by many Twitter users as a self-indulgent, uncivilised and meaningless event.

Many even tweeted in anger that the gathering, which had caused massive traffic congestion, had also spoiled what should have been their relaxed weekend.

A user with Twitter handle @cinta4malaysia tweeted: "Less response for #KitaLawan shows that more people are rejecting this self-indulgent gathering."

Gerakan Youth chief Tan Keng Liang also tweeted: "There are 30 million Malaysians. Those few thousand at PKR #KitaLawan demo don't represent our country. Not even 0.01 percent. Stop causing chaos!"

User @hisyamnawi tweeted: "Street demonstration is so uncivilised. Our country is moving forward. Some brains, however, are still left in the Stone Age #KitaLawan."

Another user @amiruluslan said: "What are people saying the #KitaLawan rally numbers are? 10k? In all honesty, I'd say it's closer to 3k-5k - if even that."

User @theasyrafzabani tweeted: "Instead of #KitaLawan (we fight) for nobody in Sogo, it will be better if we fight our own stupidity for allowing ourselves to be used by the political party."

Meanwhile, Federal Territories Umno Youth chief Mohd Razlan Muhammad Rafii said the self-indulgent gathering organised by PKR did not mean anything, let alone having any impact on the government.

"This is just another PKR's fairy tale. The people want to move forward and most of them are fed up with this game played by PKR," he told Bernama here Saturday.

Bernama checks found that approximately 3,000 of Datuk Seri Anwar Ibrahim's supporters marched from Central Market, Jamek Mosque and PAS headquarters before they gathered in front of Sogo shopping complex at 3.45 pm.

Also present was PKR vice-president Nurul Izzah Anwar.

The movement of the participants was closely monitored by police until they finally dispersed at 6.30 pm.

The gathering was held in support of Anwar, who is now serving his five-year jail sentence in Sungai Buloh Prison after the Federal Court, on Feb 10, rejected his final appeal against

his conviction and jail sentence for sodomising his former aide Mohd Saiful Bukhari Azlan in 2008.
