

Muhyiddin's Visit Keeps Limbang People's Hopes Afloat

LIMBANG, May 12 (Bernama) -- Deputy Prime Minister Tan Sri Muhyiddin Yassin's scheduled working visit to Limbang this Thursday seems to have kept the people's hopes afloat, especially to help make their dreams a reality.

Limbang Member of Parliament Hasbi Habibollah said among the dreams were to have a new building for the oldest school in the district, Sekolah Menengah Kerajaan (SMK) Limbang.

"SMK Limbang is over 50 years of age now. All Limbang-born elected representatives received their secondary education there. The proposal to have a new building for the school had been repeatedly raised. We really hope to hear a good news soon," he told Bernama here.

Hasbi said the students and staff at SMK Limbang now numbered over 1,200 and to cater for the rising number of students, even the girls' hostel had to be used as classrooms.

"So, it is the people's hope that during the visit to Limbang this Thursday, Muhyiddin, who is also Education Minister, will be able to see for himself the poor condition of the building at SMK Limbang," he said.

Hasbi said Muhyiddin was also scheduled to go on a walkabout at Pasar Tamu Limbang and have breakfast with the local residents.

"During the walkabout and breakfast, the people can voice out the problems they're facing in Limbang to the deputy prime minister," he said.

Tomorrow, Muhyiddin is scheduled to attend dinner in conjunction with the Education Services Conference in Miri.
