

Document On Intercepted Call On Lahad Datu Intrusion Re-Typed Twice - Witness Bernama

KOTA KINABALU, May 21 (Bernama) -- A document on an intercepted telephone conversation linked to the Lahad Datu intrusion which occurred about two years ago, was re-typed twice, the High Court here was told today.

Bukit Aman Special Branch (SB) officer Supt Norliah Selamat said when she re-typed the document on the telephone conversation into a simpler format, she typed it again after making some changes.

"Since there was a large number of documents which I printed, I believe both of the re-typed documents were mistakenly put together in a file," she said under cross-examination.

To a question by counsel Datuk N. Sivananthan, the policewoman could not remember which document was the first document she had re-typed and which was the improved version.

The SB officer was testifying in the trial of 30 individuals linked to the intrusion that took place at Kampung Tanduo in Lahad Datu in February 2013.

Norliah said on April 26, 2013, she was assigned to re-type documents of communication interception products on 10 suspects, which took her about a week to complete.

In the dock are 27 Filipinos and three local residents who are facing one to multiple charges of being members of a terrorist group and waging war against the Yang di-Pertuan Agong.

They are also alleged to have recruited members for a terrorist group or wilfully harboured individuals they knew to be members of a terrorist group.

The offences were allegedly committed between Feb 12 and April 10, 2013.

The hearing before Justice Stephen Chung at the Sabah Prisons Department continues tomorrow.
