

Asean bridge to be toll free on June 1

Effective June 1, Malaysian-registered vehicles will enjoy a smooth ride crossing the Asean bridge as the RM10 toll will be abolished.

Chief Minister Tan Sri Adenan Satem, in announcing the abolishment of the toll, hoped it would reduce the burden of motorists who had to cross the bridge linking Malaysia and Brunei.

"I would like to thank Shin Yang Group of Companies for their cooperation in abolishing the toll for the benefit of Malaysian motorists," he said at the 10th Miri City anniversary celebrations last night.

Officially opened on August 30, 2003, the RM178 million bridge is the vital link for those driving from Miri to Brunei, Limbang and Kota Kinabalu with a toll of RM10 for a one-way trip.

This is the second toll waiver with the first being for the Lanang bridge in Sibu when Adenan announced the abolition of toll of 50 sen for motorcycles, RM3 (car), RM5 (van and four-wheel-drive) and RM10 (lorry and bus) which comes into effect on May 25.
