

Allegation PM Uses Public Fund Illogical - Shabery Cheek

KUANTAN, July 4 (Bernama) -- Communication and Multimedia Minister Datuk Seri Ahmad Shabery Cheek regarded the allegation that Prime Minister Datuk Seri Najib Tun Razak used government funds for personal gain as an illogical claim.

"People will say it is not logical, if someone is to take the people's money worth more than RM2 billion and put it into his own account, it is not reasonable.

"It would have been surely detected by all the financial systems and banks very easily, so if people believe such stories, we must be careful because I am worried there is an ulterior motive to destroy the economy and national image," he said.

He said this when asked to comment on the exposure of Wall Street Journal (WSJ) which reported that Malaysian investigators had allegedly detected almost RM2.6 billion (US\$700 million) which had been deposited into what they believed to be the personal bank account of the Prime Minister.

IMDB and Najib himself had refuted the matter and regarded the lie as one more effort to topple the government, he said.

"Many people say WSJ will not publish a news report without checking it out but basically it used a Sarawak Report whose credibility is questionable.

"Prior to this, PetroSaudi International Ltd (PetroSaudi) had lodged a police report over tampered documents in the Sarawak Report and an individual was arrested over the case.

"If we are to fully believe in the United States, at one point in time, this country had alleged that Iraq had weapons of mass destruction, but until it was totally annihilated, the weapons were not found," he said.

In this regard, he said all quarters, including the people, must be patient and wait for the result of an investigation by certified audits including from abroad on IMDB before judging it.
