

**1MDB Issue: Cabinet United In Allowing Process Takes Its Course – Khairy

PUTRAJAYA, July 8 (Bernama) -- The Cabinet is united in the view that all parties have to allow the due process to take its course following the alleged transfer of 1MDB funds into Prime Minister Datuk Seri Najib Tun Razak's personal bank account.

Youth and Sports Minister Khairy Jamaluddin said the Cabinet at its meeting today, discussed current issues including The Wall Street Journal's (WSJ) article.

"There was a discussion started off by the prime minister, saying he was still considering legal action, and as you all know by now the lawyers representing the prime minister will send a letter to The Wall Street Journal."

He said this when met by reporters after the launching of the Perdana Fellowship 2015 programme by Najib at Perdana Putra, here, today.

Khairy said until the special task force set up to investigate the allegations came up with the results of the investigation, it was too premature to come up with anything else on the matter.

Asked whether the allegation was a conspiracy to remove the prime minister, he replied: "I don't see that. I am unable to comment."

Last Friday, WSJ published a report claiming that almost US\$700 million (RM2.6 billion) in funds from government investment company 1Malaysia Development Berhad (1MDB) had been channelled to the prime minister's personal bank account.

On the same day, the Prime Minister's Office dismissed the WSJ report and said it was a political sabotage to topple a democratically-elected prime minister.

1MDB also stated that it had never channelled funds to Najib.

The special task force has ordered a freeze on six bank accounts linked to the case.

The task force officials visited the 1MDB office to conduct the enquiry today.
