

Nazir says all's well in Razak family despite differences with Najib

CIMB Group chairman Datuk Seri Nazir Razak today said that he has voiced his concerns about the administration to his brother, Prime Minister Datuk Seri Najib Razak, but stopped short of giving details of their conversations.

Nazir, who has been publicly critical of the government, yesterday spoke out against the Home Ministry's decision to suspend The Edge Financial Daily and The Edge Weekly.

"I had conversations with my brother. But I won't share them with you," he told reporters at former prime minister Tun Abdullah Ahmad Badawi's Hari Raya open house in Putrajaya today.

Nazir insisted that "all is okay" in the Razak household despite his disagreements with elder brother's administrative decisions.

Nazir said this when asked by reporters if he had spoken to Najib about his opinions regarding current affairs in the country, including The Edge's suspension.

Nazir has been vocal in criticising the current affairs in the country and also Putrajaya's policies.

He had reportedly announced plans to set up a civil society platform to enable Malaysians to voice out concerns about the country's socio-political environment.

He had however refuted rumours that he might be setting up a new political party.

Nazir is the youngest son in the Razak family, while Najib is the eldest. – July 26, 2015.
