

**MH370: Malay'sian Investigators Head For Maldives To Verify Plane Parts**

KUALA LUMPUR, Aug 11 (Bernama) -- The Malaysian investigation team will leave for The Maldives tonight, to verify objects believed to be parts of the Malaysia Airlines Flight MH370 aircraft which vanished from the radar in March last year.

Transport Deputy Minister Datuk Ab Aziz Kaprawi said the investigation team would be led by Department of Civil Aviation (DCA) director-general Datuk Azharuddin Abdul Rahman.

He said the objects found in the Maldives would be brought back to Malaysia for analysis.

"We (Malaysia) have an understanding with the authorities there (the Maldives)...we think the parts which were found about a month ago were parts of the aircraft.

"They have to be further analysed and will be brought back to Malaysia for verification," he told reporters at the Hari Raya and 130th anniversary celebrations of the Keretapi Tanah Melayu (KTM) Berhad here Tuesday.

Also present was KTM Berhad president Leftenan-Kolonel Sarbini Tijan.

Flight MH370 from Kuala Lumpur to Beijing with its 239 passengers and crew, vanished on March 8.

On Aug 6, this year, Prime Minister Datuk Seri Najib Tun Razak confirmed that the parts of the flaperon found on France's territory, The Reunion Island was part of the aircraft.
