

**Most Of Debris Found In The Maldives Not Related To MH370 - Liow Tiong Lai**

KUALA LUMPUR, Aug 14 (Bernama) -- Most of the debris found in the Maldives are not related to Malaysia Airlines flight MH370, said Transport Minister Datuk Seri Liow Tiong Lai.

"Most of the debris are negative. They're are not related to MH370 and they are not plane material," he told reporters at a function here today.

Liow said this was based on the report received from the Malaysian team dispatched to the Maldives who had seen the debris.

"We'll wait for their return. If there's any debris they bring back they'll hand it over to the international investigation team," he said.

The Malaysian investigation team flew to the Maldives last Tuesday to verify objects believed to be from MH370 which vanished from radar screens in March last year.

The plane was flying from Kuala Lumpur to Beijing with 239 people aboard.

On Aug 6, Prime Minister Datuk Seri Najib Tun Razak confirmed that the aircraft debris washed up on Reunion island was indeed from the missing Boeing 777.
