

Morais Murder: One Of 5 Suspects Owned Car Workshop

KUALA LUMPUR, Sept 18 (Bernama) -- The police have confirmed that a car workshop in Subang Jaya near here, where prominent deputy public prosecutor was held before he was bludgeoned to death is owned by one of five suspects held in connection with the killing.

Kuala Lumpur police chief Datuk Tajuddin Md Isa said the workshop located in USJ 3 came under police investigation as it was located not far from where the body of Anthony Kevin Morais was found.

"It (the workshop) belongs to one of the suspects...other information is still under investigation and cannot be disclosed (as yet).

"I urge those who have information related to the case to facilitate investigations," he told reporters after the launch of the Total Enforcement Pilot Project in Brickfields here today.

Bukit Aman Crime Prevention and Community Safety Department director, Datuk Acryl Sani Abdullah Sani officiated at the event.

Previously, the police had only suspected that the workshop belonged to the suspect due to its close proximity to where Morais' body was found at Persiaran Subang Mewah in USJ1.

On Wednesday, a police team found the body dumped in a barrel filled with concrete in Subang Jaya near here after one of the suspects led the police to the location.

Morais, 55, deputy chief of the Appellate and Trial Division in the Attorney-General's Chambers was last seen leaving his apartment in Menara Duta, here on Sept 4, to go to his office in Putrajaya.

He was driving a government-issue grey Proton Perdana bearing registration number WA6264Q when a car rammed into his vehicle before several people, believed to be hired killers abducted him.

The next day, the victim's car was found torched and abandoned at an oil palm plantation in Hutan Melintang, Perak.
