

Police Say Missing DPP Morais Abducted, Based On CCTV Footage

KUALA LUMPUR, Sept 9 (Bernama) -- The police have classified as abduction the case of a deputy public prosecutor who has gone missing, based on images gleaned from highway closed circuit television cameras.

Kuala Lumpur CID chief Datuk Zainuddin Ahmad said the footage was obtained from CCTV cameras along the route usually taken by Anthony Kevin Morais, the deputy chief of the appellate and trials division in the Attorney-General's Chambers, who went missing last Friday.

"The police will examine the CCTV footage and conduct a thorough investigation.

"The police will release the CCTV footage when the time comes. Let us look at the CCTV recording first," he said when contacted by Bernama.

Zainuddin said the police should be given room to investigate the case.

Asked whether Morais' family members or close friends had received calls or threats from the abductors, he said there had been none so far.

Morais was reported missing last Friday after he left his apartment in Menara Duta, Kuala Lumpur, to get to his office in Putrajaya.

He reportedly drove a grey Proton Perdana car bearing registration number WA6264Q.

On Monday, police set up a special taskforce headed by Zainuddin himself to investigate the case.
