

Another suspect arrested in Morais murder as police look for witnesses

A 22-year-old man is the latest to be arrested in connection with the murder of deputy public prosecutor (DPP) Kevin Morais, whose remains were found yesterday in a cement-filled drum in USJ 1, Subang Jaya, 12 days after he went missing.

In a statement this evening, police also said they have obtained a seven-day remand for the unemployed suspect, who was detained in Kulim, Kedah at 5pm yesterday.

Five others, including a military doctor, were detained on Tuesday while police also picked up a woman and a child, who are not believed to be involved in the case.

Police had earlier said that the military doctor, a colonel in his 50s who is attached with the pathology lab at Hospital Angkatan Tentera Tuanku Mizan, is the main suspect in Morais's murder.

Morais was the DPP in a 2013 case when the doctor was charged with corruption.

Police are also looking for witnesses to the accident, when the suspects had knocked into Morais's car, before abducting him along Jalan Duta Mas in Kuala Lumpur at 7.51am on September 4.

"We are especially looking for information from the driver or passengers in a white Toyota Estima, which had stopped to see the incident taking place, as seen in the CCTV footage," said the statement.

Morais, who was attached with the Attorney-General's Chambers, was reported missing on September 4 after he left his Menara Duta residence for work.

A post-mortem was conducted at the Kuala Lumpur Hospital yesterday and the cause of death is expected to be announced soon. – September 17, 2015.
