

Sabah Umno division wants disciplinary action against Muhyiddin

The Penampang Umno division in Sabah has passed a resolution calling for disciplinary action against deputy president Tan Sri Muhyiddin Yassin for not upholding the party's good name, The Star reported today.

The division said Muhyiddin had made detrimental speeches at the Cheras, Pagoh, Kluang and Semporna division meetings which it said violated the Umno constitution.

According to The Star report, the division also said that the axed deputy prime minister was wrong to openly speak about his private conversations with Umno president Datuk Seri Najib Razak on party and national issues.

"In fact, what the deputy president has done can destroy and bury the party in the next general election," the resolution said, according to the report.

The motion was raised at the division's annual general meeting on Saturday by Nambazan branch chief Datuk Freddie Suah.

Penampang Umno chief Datuk John Ambrose said the division approved the resolution on the basis that all members were subject to party rules.

"As a deputy president, Muhyiddin should lead by example for other members to respect party regulations but his actions proved otherwise," he reportedly said.

Muhyiddin and Umno vice-president Datuk Seri Mohd Shafie Apdal were dropped in the July 28 Cabinet reshuffle, which many said was due to their criticism of state investment firm 1Malaysia Development Bhd (1MDB) which has accumulated debts of RM42 billion in six years of operation.

The duo in their speeches at party divisional meetings also raised the issue of 1MDB and the RM2.6 billion in Najib's personal accounts, which the Malaysian Anti-Corruption Commission said was from an unknown Middle East donor. – August 24, 2015.
