

**Information Leak Is Not Related To Investigations Against SRC International – MACC

PUTRAJAYA, Nov 5 (Bernama) -- The Malaysian Anti-Corruption Commission (MACC) today stressed that the issue of the information leak, was not related to the commission's investigation of SRC International Bhd (SRC).

MACC investigations director Datuk Azam Baki said that the information leak was a different matter, stressing that the commission would continue its investigations into the company, although there was a special investigation into the information leak issue as reported previously.

"MACC only acts within the rule of law enacted by the Parliament, and does not want any interference that may delay or affect its investigations.

"Indeed MACC's investigations cannot be interrupted or suspended on the grounds of having to wait until the investigations relating to the information leaks reported previously have been completed first," he said, referring to the SRC's media statement Thursday.

SRC, in a statement said: "While SRC holds the MACC in high regard, we are concerned about the recent wave of leakages or possible sale of classified information to members of the media and irresponsible, self-interested politicians."

SRC also requested the Attorney General to commence an independent investigation to identify those responsible for the leakages or possible sale of classified information, involving agenda-driven politicians and/or corrupt officers.

"Upon the completion of this investigation by the Attorney General, we will fully cooperate with MACC or any other lawful authorities with respect to any enquiries," the statement said.

Azam said that if SRC's statement regarding the matter was true, it was as if the company did not want MACC to investigate it.

He said that any party which obstructed an investigation by MACC, could be acted upon under the MACC Act 2009.
