

**Chinese Premier To Undertake Two-Day Visit To Malaysia**

KUALA LUMPUR, Nov 18 (Bernama) -- China's Premier of the State Council Li Keqiang will undertake a two-day working visit to Malaysia beginning Sunday, as part of his participation in the 27th ASEAN Summit and Related Summits.

The Foreign Ministry (Wisma Putra) in a statement here today said this would be his maiden visit to Malaysia since his appointment as the Premier of the People's Republic of China in 2013.

During the visit, Li will be accompanied by his wife, Cheng Hong, ministers and other senior officers from the country.

It said the programme of Li's official visit will include an Official Welcoming Ceremony, a Restricted and a Delegation Meeting with Prime Minister Datuk Seri Najib Tun Razak.

Both leaders are scheduled to witness the signing of several government-to-government Memorandums of Understanding/Agreements.

This include taking stock of progress made under the Malaysia-China 'Strategic Comprehensive Partnership' and discussing enhancement of many areas of sectoral cooperation for the two countries' mutual benefit.

In addition, both Najib and Li are also expected to exchange views on regional and global issues that are of common interest to both sides.

In fact, Najib and wife Datin Seri Rosmah Mansor will also host an official dinner in honour of Li's visit.

China has remained as Malaysia's biggest trading partner for seven consecutive years and the bilateral trade value has hit USD100 billion (RM436.88 billion) for two years in a row.

In 2014, total trade between the two countries was recorded at USD102 billion (RM 445.62 billion).
