

**Malaysia Condemns Ankara Car Bomb Attack**

KUALA LUMPUR, March 14 (Bernama) -- Malaysia strongly condemns the car bomb attack in Ankara yesterday that has so far killed 34 people and caused injuries to 125 others.

In a statement, Malaysia's Foreign Ministry said Malaysia expressed its deepest condolences and sympathies to the Government of Turkey and the families of the victims of the attack.

"Malaysia regards this latest incident as an atrocious act of terrorism and hopes that the perpetrators will be brought to justice," it said.

According to the statement, the Malaysian Embassy in Ankara was in close contact with Turkish authorities in determining if any Malaysians were among those affected by the attack.

So far, there had been no indication of any Malaysian casualties.

"The ministry wishes to remind Malaysian citizens residing at or travelling to Ankara to always give utmost priority to their personal safety and the security of their surroundings," the statement added.
