

WSJ has Agenda to Tarnish Najib's Reputation – Ahmad Zahid

KUALA LUMPUR, March 2 (Bernama) -- The Wall Street Journal's repeated publication of the baseless accusations against Datuk Seri Najib Tun Razak is aimed at tarnishing the reputation of the Prime Minister, said Deputy Prime Minister Datuk Seri Dr Ahmad Zahid Hamidi.

He said WSJ repeated the news associated with Najib based on an agenda setting known only to the agency.

"Surely there is a motive for the repeat of the news and analysis, not just to discredit the PM but also to tarnish his personal reputation.

"It is unfair (of WSJ) to hurl accusations at the PM and to repeat them without stating concrete facts when there has already been an explanation by the Attorney-General and 1Malaysia Development Berhad," he said.

Ahmad Zahid spoke to reporters after opening the Civil Servants Housing Convention 2016 organised by Cuepacs and Angkasa, the national cooperative movement.

Asked what action would be taken against WSJ, Ahmad Zahid, who is also the Home Minister, said the matter was left to the Communications and Multimedia Ministry and the Malaysian Communications and Multimedia Commission.
