

DPM: Discovery of Bombs in Damansara Perdana not linked to Terrorists

KUALA LUMPUR, April 17 (Bernama) -- Deputy Prime Minister Datuk Seri Dr Ahmad Zahid Hamidi said the discovery of homemade bombs in a condominium unit in Damansara Perdana early Sunday has nothing to do with Daesh terrorists.

He said based on initial investigations, police believed that the bombs were to be used in a criminal activity involving several individuals and not for terrorism purposes.

"Police concluded that it has nothing to do with Daesh and IS...the national security is still under control, we are giving assurance to the public, especially to residents of the (Damansara Perdana) condominium, the police are in the full state of preparedness to face any possibilities," he told reporters after attending 'An Evening With Deputy Prime Minister' event at Gapena House here.

Over 200 residents of the condominium were shocked after being informed that five homemade bombs were found in one of the unit early today.

Petaling Jaya District Police chief ACP Mohd Zani Che Din said the bombs were found during a raid on house on the 17th floor of the building at 4.30 am.

The case is being investigated under the Explosives Act 1957.
