

**Liboi and Brenda Grateful For Opportunity to Meet PM Up-Close**

SERIAN, April 28 (Bernama) -- On Nov 13, 1966, Liboi Nong could only observe from afar, Malaysia's deputy prime minister, Tun Abdul Razak Hussein when he visited her village, Kampung Triboh.

Recalling the historical occasion nearly 50 years ago, she said the visit by the Number Two national leader had been eagerly awaited by the villagers.

Unfortunately at that time she was still in confinement after giving birth, so her wish to meet Tun Abdul Razak was not to be.

"My house was just about 50 metres from the spot where he launched this village (renamed Kampung Tun Razak in conjunction with the visit). I could only stand in front of the window and watch from afar.

"My baby was then only four days old," she told Bernama when met here today.

But today, Liboi, now 70, was among the hundreds of residents in Kampung Triboh (Kampung Tun Razak), in a case of 'history repeating itself', to meet and greet Tun Razak's son Datuk Seri Najib Tun Razak who had followed in the footsteps of his father to come to the village.

Despite having to stand under the scorching sun, Liboi with other villagers patiently waited for the prime minister to arrive.

"I am so happy and grateful to be able to meet and shake Prime Minister Datuk Seri Najib's hand," she gushed.

Meanwhile, Brenda Dana, 43, who is self-employed, described Najib's visit to Kampung Triboh as indelible to the residents.

"Prior to this occasion, I had been jotting notes in the prime minister's official Facebook account inviting him to come to this village which his father had visited.

"I am so grateful indeed and I thank the prime minister for responding and making this visit that we residents had been looking forward to," she said.
