

TMJ Shares Vision, Mission On Malaysian Football With Najib

KUALA LUMPUR, Feb 22 (Bernama) -- Football Association of Malaysia (FAM) presidential candidate Tunku Ismail Sultan Ibrahim said the vision and mission he has on the Malaysian football are well-supported by Prime Minister Datuk Seri Najib Tun Razak.

The Johor Darul Ta'zim (JDT) club owner said Najib was also excited about the direction and changes he would bring should he be elected to helm the national football governing body.

"The prime minister seems to understand my agenda and he has the desire to see the changes on the teams and the leagues in Malaysia.
