

Mohamad Adib continues to get sympathy of national leaders

KUALA LUMPUR, Nov 30 (Bernama) -- Fireman Muhammad Adib Mohd Kassim, who was seriously hurt in a riot at the Sri Maha Mariamman temple, USJ 25, Subang Jaya, last Tuesday, continues to get the sympathy and attention of national leaders.

Deputy Yang di-Pertuan Agong Sultan Nazrin Shah was the latest to visit the 24-year-old at the National Heart Institute (IJN).

His Majesty arrived at IJN at 9am today and was met by Fire and Rescue Department director-general Datuk Muhammad Hamdan Wahid.

Sultan Nazrin spent almost 30 minutes with Muhammad Adib, who is a member of the Subang Jaya Emergency Response System (EMRS) unit.

Later in the evening, Deputy Prime Minister Datuk Seri Dr Wan Azizah Wan Ismail also spent about 30 minutes with Muhammad Adib and his family at IJN.

Dr Wan Azizah advised that fewer people be allowed to visit Muhammad Adib so as to ensure that he would get the best treatment possible.

Earlier, Kedah Menteri Besar Datuk Seri Mukhriz Tun Mahathir also visited Muhammad Adib and said the state government would help the fireman's family in Kuala Kedah in anyway it could.

Mukhriz said the state government had provided aid to the fireman's family when Sultan Kedah Sultan Sallehuddin Sultan Badlishah visited Muhammad Adib at the IJN on Thursday.

The aid was handed over by State Secretary Datuk Bakar Din who was accompanying the

sultan on the visit.

Meanwhile, IJN chief executive officer Datuk Seri Dr Mohd Azhari Yakub said Muhammad Adib had woken up from his medically-induced comatose condition and showed positive development this morning.

He said the fireman could respond to some verbal instructions from medical specialists.

“We classified his condition as critical but stable. We are happy with his progress in the last 24 and 48 hours,” he told a press conference here.

In Ipoh, Inspector-General of Police Tan Sri Mohamad Fuzi Harun told reporters that the situation at the temple was almost back to normal following the chaotic situations on Monday and Tuesday.

He also said that 42 people had been arrested to assist in police investigations into the incidents.
