

Gerakan Youth pledges non-racial struggle

KUALA LUMPUR: Gerakan Youth has pledged to give its commitment to fostering a non-racial political struggle.

This is one of the resolutions passed by the wing's annual delegates conference yesterday.

It also reaffirmed its support for the use of Bahasa Malaysia as the national language and for the use of other vernacular languages to be retained. Other resolutions adopted included:

- supporting efforts to overcome corruption, money politics and improve the public delivery system;
- calling on the Government to retain meritocracy in the admission of students into local public universities;
- enhancing inter-racial co-op-

eration and ensuring the economic pie can be enjoyed by all;

- supporting Prime Minister Datuk Seri Abdullah Ahmad Badawi in all his endeavours; and,
- calling on the Government to continue with its poverty eradication programmes.

Besides these resolutions, the wing also passed several others, including:

- focusing on developing expertise and generic skills in various vocations in the education system;
- ensuring equal treatment of women leaders based on meritocracy; and,
- accepting women leaders into international political arenas, especially where women affairs are concerned.
