

“Don’t be embarrassed by M’sian democracy”

SHAH ALAM: Malaysians should not feel embarrassed by criticisms from the West that the democratic system here is not as liberal as theirs, said former prime minister Tun Dr Mahathir Mohamad.

Malaysians should realise that the democracy practised in Malaysia was for the good of the country and the people, he said, adding that the country and its people should not be sacrificed for democracy.

“We’ve seen how liberal democracies have destroyed cultures, morals and religions. We need not legalise the destructions in the name of democracy.

“We should take what is good and discard the bad,” he said in an acceptance speech after being conferred an honorary Doctorate in Political Science and Government by Universiti Teknologi Mara

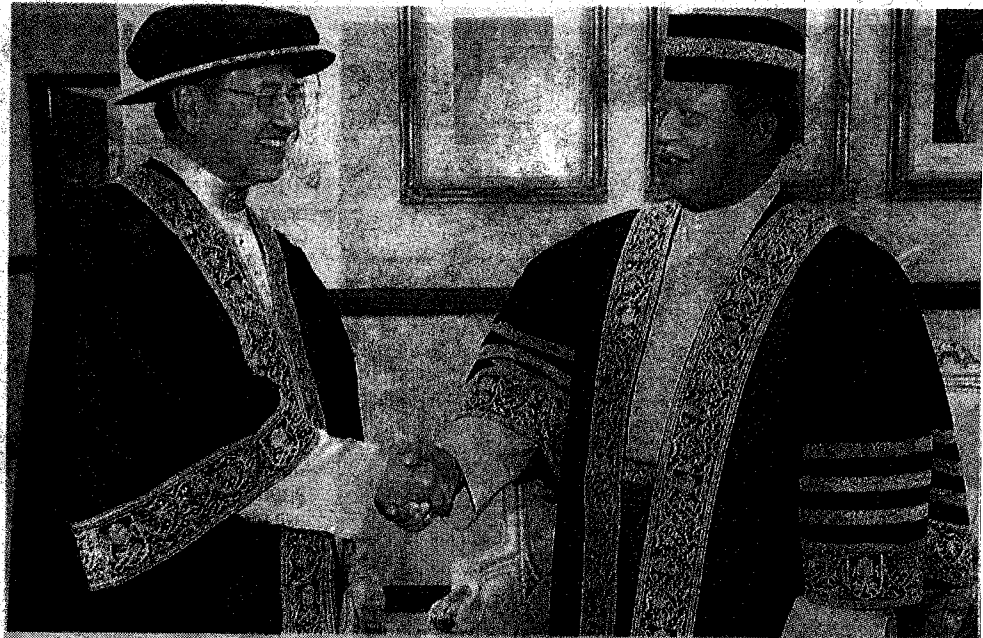

Raja Permaisuri Agong Tuanku Fauziah Tengku Abdul Rashid; Dr Mahathir’s wife, Tun Dr Siti Hasmah Mohd Ali; and Higher Education Minister Datuk Dr Shafie Mohd Salleh were present at the ceremony.

Dr Mahathir said democracy was a very difficult system and exposed to the possibilities of corruption, chaos and anarchy.

Killings and all sorts of crimes that occurred in several developing countries that tried to practise democratic system were proof of how difficult and dangerous democratic practices can be, he said.
