

Najib stands by Pak Lah

NEW DELHI: Datuk Seri Najib Tun Razak has urged all political leaders, Umno members and the people to give their full support to Prime Minister Datuk Seri Abdullah Ahmad Badawi.

Expressing his confidence in Abdullah's leadership, the Deputy Prime Minister said he would stand by him in managing the country.

"I believe that every Prime Minister will do what is best for the country, based on prevailing conditions and situations.

"I believe that when Tun Dr Mahathir (Mohamad) was the Prime Minister, he did what was best for the nation.

"Similarly, now that Pak Lah is the Prime Minister, he will do his best for the country," he told reporters covering his week-long official visit to India.

He said that Dr Mahathir's contributions to the nation would always be appreciated, valued and remembered by the people.

June 26, 2002 - Dr Mahathir announces that Abdullah will succeed him. Date of Dr. Mahathir's retirement was later fixed on 31st Oct 2003.

Oct 31, 2003 - Abdullah sworn in as fifth Malaysian Premier

Mar 21, 2004 - Abdullah leads Barisan Nasional to a landslide victory in the General Election, winning over 90% of Parliament seats. BN also regains Terengganu from PAS.

May 31, 2005 - Dr Mahathir as Proton adviser lashes out on the awarding of Approved Permits (AP), marking the start of the AP war.

April 12, 2006 - Cabinet cancels the construction of the "scenic" bridge -- a project approved under the Mahathir administration.

April 14, 2006 - Dr Mahathir criticises the Cabinet's decision on the bridge, claiming the government had caved in to Singapore's demands.

May 16, 2006 - Dr Mahathir denies any association with a DVD of him criticising Abdullah.
