

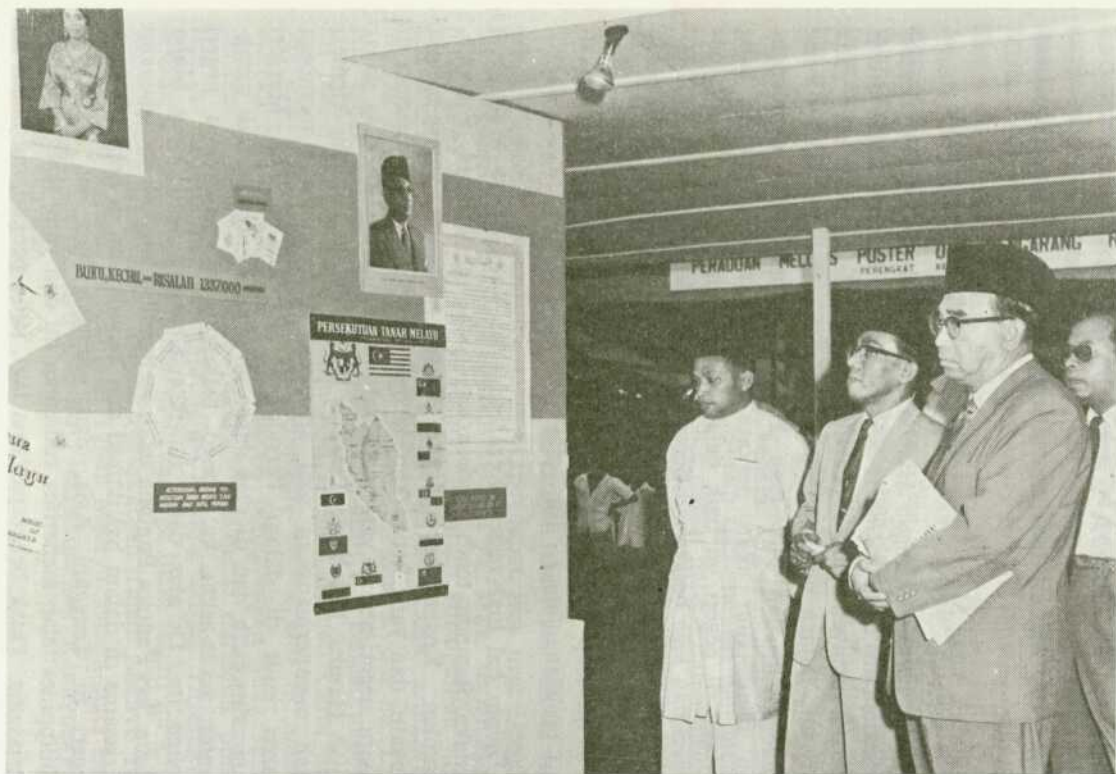
SPEECH BY THE MINISTER OF DEFENCE AT
THE PRESENTATION OF A GIFT FROM THE
ROYAL MILITARY ACADEMY, AT KUALA
LUMPUR ON 20TH JULY, 1961

To accept a gift is always an occasion of pleasure. In this case, coming as it does from the Royal Military Academy at Sandhurst, the pleasure is made greater because, not only is the gift most acceptable for its own sake, but it serves to forge yet another link in the chain which binds our two Academies together. It will be an ever present and tangible sign of the co-operation which has always existed and will I am confident continue to exist between them.
