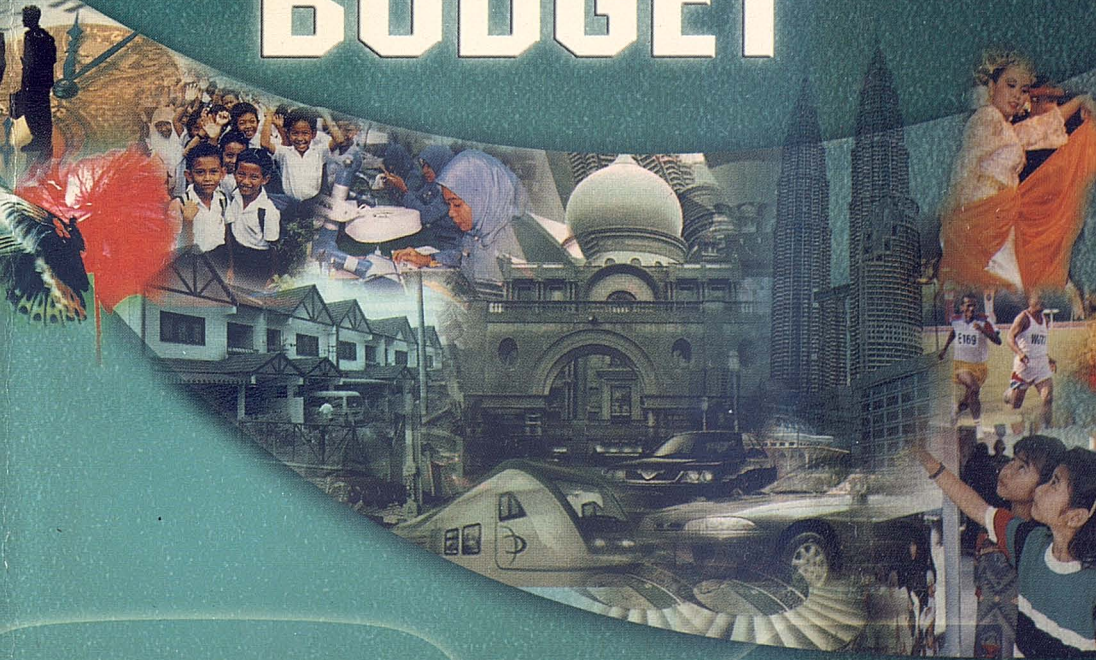

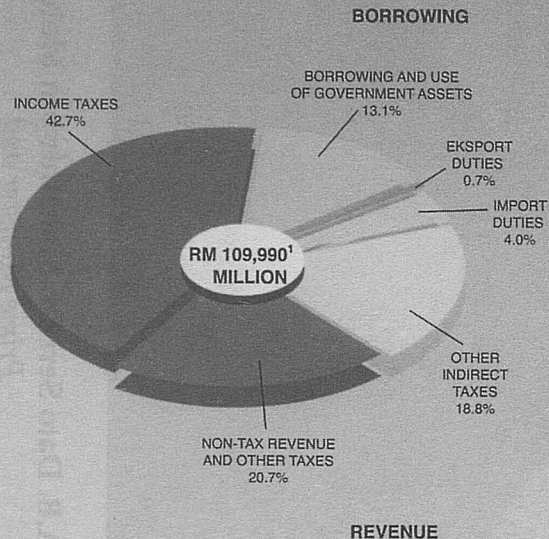

harmonious Malaysian society."*



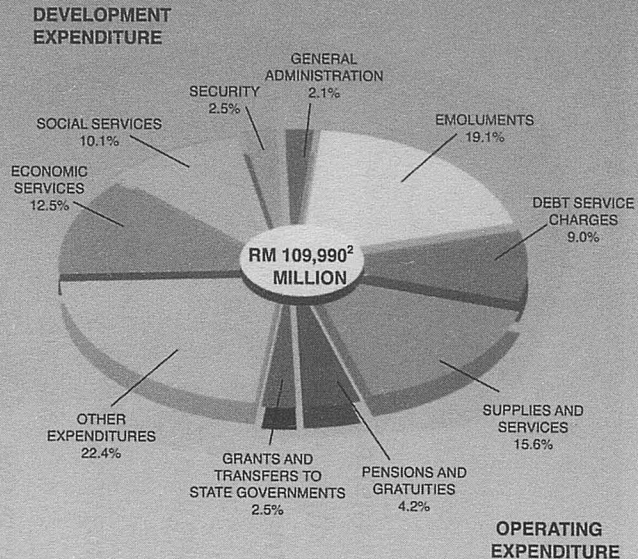

## WHERE IT GOES

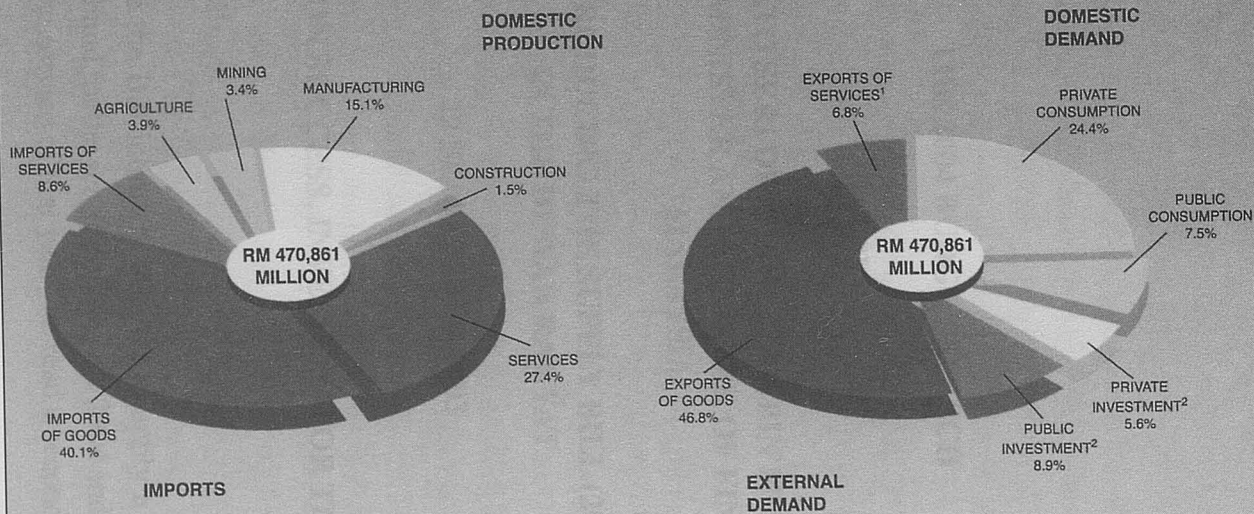
