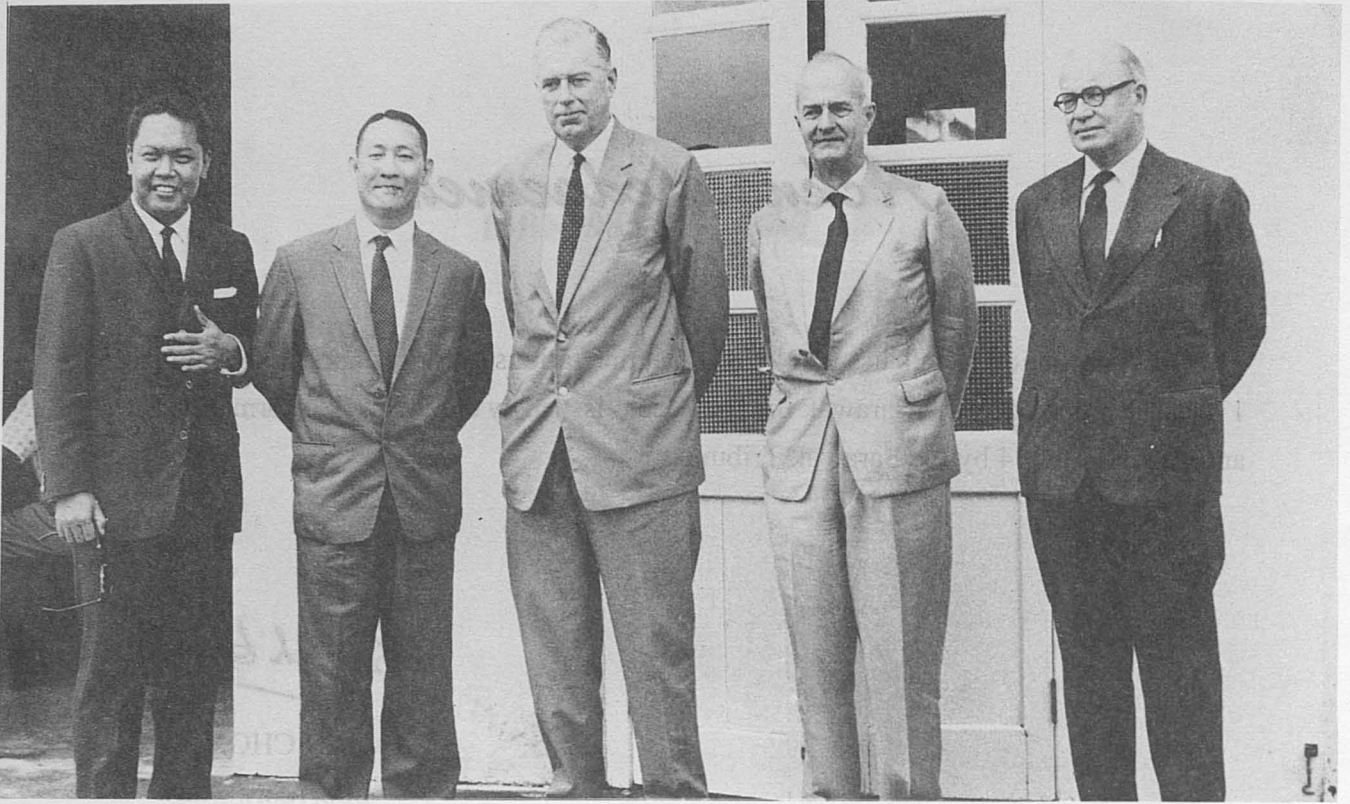

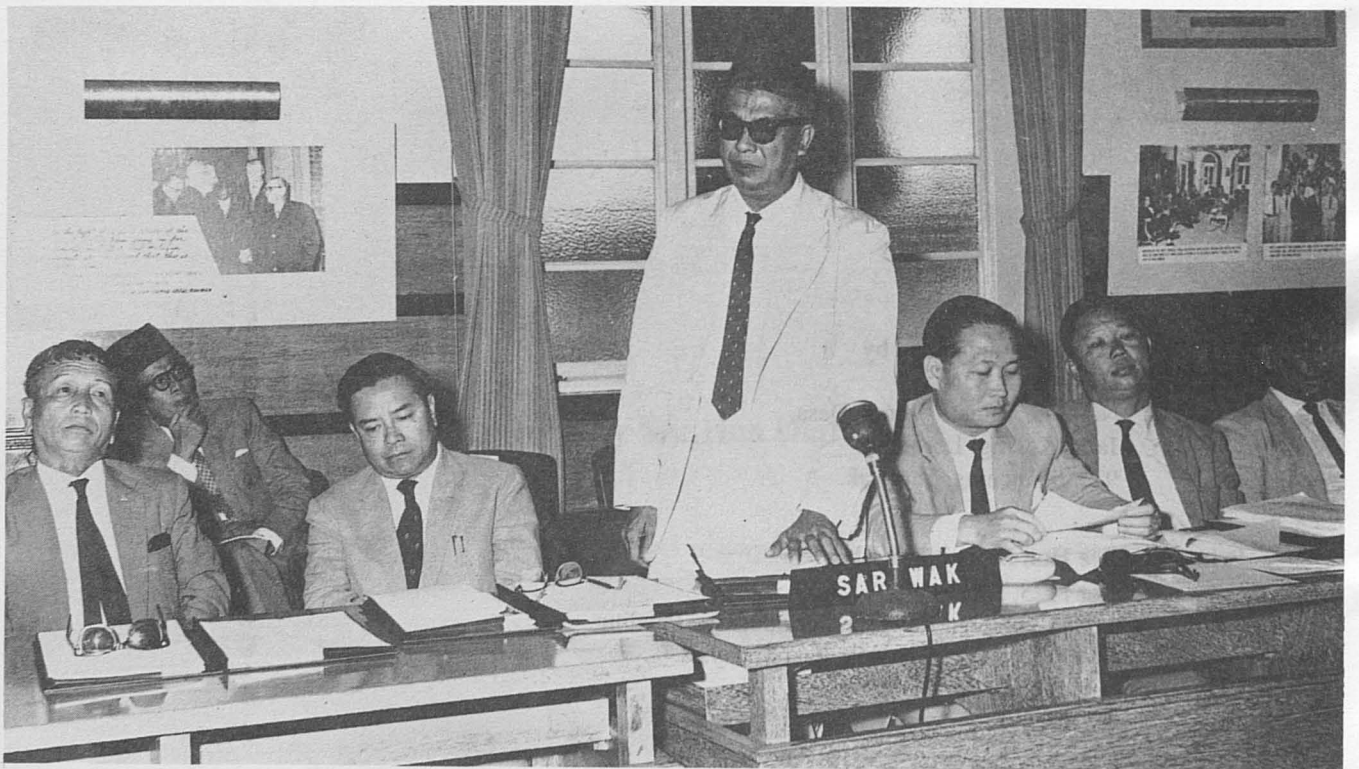


The views of the people of Sabah and Sarawak towards Malaysia were sounded in early 1962 by a Commission headed by Lord Cobbold.
