He also has been active with a number of NGOs and civil society organizations internationally, including the Highlander Center in the United States and Oxfam in the UK. He is the director of the Development Research Centre on Citizenship, Participation and Accountability.

Rosemary McGee has been a research fellow in the Participation, Power and Social Change Team at the Institute of Development Studies since 1999. She has extensive work experience in policy and programme posts in the international development NGO sector. Her research and teaching focus on forms of citizen participation in decision-making, governance and rights-claiming processes, and on the international aid system, both official and non-governmental. Her doctoral research was conducted in a violence-torn region of Colombia, as was much of her NGO work, and she continues to work closely on that country as well as others in Latin America and Africa.
