In 1979 he became the world's first Professor of Leadership Studies at the University of Surrey, where he is still a visiting professor. He is internationally known as a consultant. He holds higher degrees from the Universities of Oxford and London. He has recently been listed among the 40 men and women who have done most to change the face of management today. He is Chairman of John Adair and Associates, a consultancy which specialises in developing effective leadership.
